

Feed Your Heart With The Words Of Your Mouth

God gave me a new revelation of this old truth, and I would like to share it with you.

Just like God has ordained for us to feed our bodies through our mouths, He has ordained for us to feed our hearts with the words of our mouths.

Faith is the power that gives the Christian person life.

The Word of God says that "the just shall live by faith" (Romans 1:17), and that faith comes by hearing the anointed Word of God (Romans 10:17).

We live by what we eat, both physically and spiritually, according to the Word of God.

The prophetic ministry operates by words spoken in faith from the heart inspired by the Holy Spirit, and then God brings it to pass according to our faith in His written Word.

We receive our salvation by confessing with our mouth what we believe in our hearts: "If you **confess with your mouth**, 'Jesus is Lord,' and **believe in your heart** that God raised him from the dead, **you will be saved**. For it is with **your heart that you believe and are justified**, and it is with **your mouth that you confess and are saved**. (Romans 10:9,10)

This is the way that we receive every blessing from God: believing in our hearts and confessing with our mouths positive words based on God's written promises.

God wants us to succeed, and for that we need to believe. This will happen when we keep God's Word in our mouths (Joshua 1:8), and when we say that we can do it, even before we see it happen with our natural eyes (Philippians 4:13).

We, as humans, all have a built in "believer," in other words, we all believe. **But what we believe is decided by to what we give time and room.**

When we do what is written in Romans 12:1,2 by presenting our bodies as living sacrifices unto God, and having our minds renewed to His Word, **He, in turn, gives us a measure of His Faith** (Romans 12:3).

So, whatever you are praying and believing God for in your life, start to confess it to the spirit world. Base your confession on the Word of God and that Word will definitely make it come to pass!
