



God's Will Is Not Automatic

Many believers have been raised to believe that if God wants something, it will come to pass automatically. However, according to the Word of God, if the will of man is involved it will not come to pass automatically. God has always had people that he has called to pray for his will to come to pass. Even before Messiah came, people were interceding that the promise of the Anointed One would be fulfilled.

To prove the point, let us just take an obvious truth that it is God's will for all men to be saved, and for none to perish. We know it is God's will but yet it will not happen. Why? Because man's will has something to do with whether he accepts God's offer of salvation.

For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son, that **whosoever believeth** in him will not perish, but have everlasting life. John 3:16

The same is true for healing as well. The Lord Yeshua has taken all our sicknesses and all our diseases and pains, so that we can be pain free and healed to serve Him, and His Kingdom. **For I am the Jehovah Rofecha. The Lord your Healer.** Exodus 15:26

Another wonderful scripture about God's will to heal is found in Psalms 103:1-3:

Bless the Lord all my soul and all that is within me bless his holy name. Bless the Lord all my soul and forget not all his benefits. Who forgiveth all my iniquities and healeth all my diseases, who delivereth my life from destruction. Hallelujah!

When God has spoken a Word faith will come. That is if the Word is received (Romans 10:17). The devil will challenge that Word, but if we continue to believe and hold fast, it will surely come to pass.

Never doubt that God will answer your prayers that are clearly promised in the Bible. Let us look at another example. God said that the blessing belonged to the first born male, but Esau lost that blessing and Jacob gained it because of the will of Esau and Jacob. Esau took the blessing for granted, but Jacob desired it with all his heart. God never changed his mind about what he had said, but man change God's will because of his actions. **God's will is not automatic.**

By the way, why would the Lord give prophetic warnings if His will was automatic?

Look at what happened to Nineveh, for example. Jonah preached destruction in 40 days, but they repented and Jonas prophetic word did not come to pass. Was Jonas a false prophet? No. The people of Nineveh change when they heard the word of God from Jonah, so God changed.

One Word that confuses many people regarding God's will and prophetic words is found in Deuteronomy 18:22:

When a prophet speaketh in the name of the LORD, if the thing follow not, nor come to pass, that is the thing which the LORD hath not spoken, but the prophet hath spoken it presumptuously: thou shalt not be afraid of him.

This Word is in reference to words that were presumptuously spoken by false prophets among the children of Israel, not about prophesies from God having to do with the will of man.

Discerning of spirits is a much needed gift in the Body of Christ today. And the prophetic anointing and office together with apostle's anointing, will spearhead this last day harvest for the Kingdom of God.

Despise not (prophetic words) prophesying. Prove all things; hold fast that which is good. (Thessalonians 5:20-21)

Pray and believe God for the answer to your Bible based petition. That is, when you clearly know the will of God regarding a matter. (Mark 11:22-26) Why? Because God's will is never automatic!
