



A Facilitator For The Holy Spirit

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The Bible tells us that **"ye are the temple (facilitators) of the Holy Spirit."** (2 Corinthians 6:16)

Our God is a Glorious God that just loves to **"pour out His Spirit on all flesh."** Acts 2:16

And He will pour out His Glory over all the earth. **"All the earth shall be filled with the Glory of the Lord."** Numbers 14:21

Because I have nothing to offer, in myself, to those that have come to get healed. But when I die to myself, I can be a facilitator to the Holy Spirit, the Spirit that brings life and healing.**

Paul said by the Holy Spirit, "I die daily", when he was addressing the church in Corinth. 1 Corinthians 15:31

Jesus was the ultimate facilitator of the Holy Spirit and showed us how we also can walk as facilitators of the Holy Spirit by denying our own lives.

He that taketh nor his cross (death) and followeth after me, is not worthy of me. Matthew 10:38

And the Holy Spirit says through John: **He that saith he abideth in Him ought himself also so to walk, even as he walked. 1 John 2:6**
