

Uphold Me With Thy Free Spirit

(July 8, 2019)

Restore unto me the joy of thy salvation; and uphold me with thy free spirit. Psalm 51:12

Only where the Spirit of the Lord is in charge is there true Freedom, like it says in 2 Corinthians 3:17. This Lord is the Spirit. Wherever the Lord's Spirit is, there is freedom.

Look at Paul and Silas in the dungeon praising God regardless of their surroundings and circumstances.

And at midnight Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God: and the prisoners heard them. And suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken: and immediately all the doors were opened, and every one's bands were loosed. And the keeper of the prison awaking out of his sleep, and seeing the prison doors open, he drew out his sword, and would have killed himself, supposing that the prisoners had been fled. But Paul cried with a loud voice, saying, Do thyself no harm: for we are all here. Then he called for a light, and sprang in, and came trembling, and fell down before Paul and Silas, And brought them out, and said, Sirs, what must I do to be saved? Acts 16:25-30

Paul and Silas praised God in (not for) their horrible circumstances, which released heaven's Spirit to come and shake the prison, set all the prisoners free, and save the prison keeper with all his family.

The Angels of the Lord came and inhabited the Praises of His Servants. <u>But thou art holy, O thou that inhabitest the praises of Israel.</u> Psalm 22:3

More then once have I myself and my family faced circumstances that seemed impossible to overcome, but time after time have we seen the hand of God deliver us, when we absolutely had no way of escape.
